Tuesday, 29 May 2012

Psalm 146:10

The LORD will reign forever, your God, O Zion, to all generations. Praise the LORD!

You do reign, and You will reign; now and forever; to this generation and to all generations to follow. All things, all circumstances, all events from the interaction of two of the very smallest of sub-atomic forces to the movements of the universe; all is being and will continue to be orchestrated by You. You are the Lord and the Master of all.

Wednesday, 30 May 2012 2 Peter 3:11-15, 18

Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn! But according to his promise we are waiting for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells.

Therefore, beloved, since you are waiting for these, be diligent to be found by him without spot or blemish, and at peace. And count the patience of our Lord as salvation ... But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen.

O Glorious Day when all the old will pass away in flame and thunder and the new heaven and the new earth will arrive in a blaze of righteousness. Diligence is to be my watchword as I seek to be without spot or blemish and patient in the service of my Lord and Savior. Thursday, 31 May 2012 Psalm 147:1-6

Praise the LORD! For it is good to sing praises to our God; for it is pleasant, and a song of praise is fitting. The LORD builds up Jerusalem; He gathers the outcasts of Israel. He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds. He determines the number of the stars; He gives to all of them their names. Friday, 1 June 2012 Psalm 147:7-9

Sing to the LORD with thanksgiving; make melody to our God on the lyre! He covers the heavens with clouds; He prepares rain for the earth; He makes grass grow on the hills. He gives to the beasts their

food, and to the young ravens that cry.

Nothing escapes Your attention; from the significant to the insignificant. There is immediacy, a You are doing this right now, You are not a clockwork god, but God of the present, of the now, covering the heavens, feeding young birds. And the in-between, the provision of my needs and the overseeing of my circumstances. Praise You, my Lord and my Master.

Saturday, 2 June 2012

Psalm 147:10-11

His delight is not in the strength of the horse, nor His pleasure in the legs of a man, but the LORD takes pleasure in those who fear Him, in those who hope in His steadfast love.

Lord, I need to <u>know</u> what it is to fear You. I need to have that awesome Presence enter into the most hidden recesses of my soul and root out any offense to You. I need to be filled to overflowing with the Glory; that the River of Living Water would pour out of my being. Awaken me, O Lord, awaken me. I need the fear of You as the Polaris of my life.
