James 4:7-10

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. Be wretched and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom. (Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you.

How often, Lord, do I get this completely backwards--submitting to the devil and going before You in pride and double-mindedness? What madness leads me to think I can stand before the LORD, God Almighty, pound my chest and declare that I am going to do it my way?

James 4:11-12

Do not speak evil against one another, brothers. The one who speaks against a brother or judges his brother, speaks evil against the law and judges the law. But if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. There is only one lawgiver and judge, he who is able to save and to destroy. But who are you to judge your neighbor?

Help me, Lord, to see those areas where a brother is failing and to pray for the Spirit is move in him. Help me to be a friend, a brother, a wise and compassionate counselor rather than a critic and a judge.

Wednesday, 3 April 2013 James 4:13-17

Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"-- yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes. Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that." As it is, you boast in your arrogance. All such boasting is evil. (17) So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin.

Lord, how often I fail to acknowledge that You are in control of all things, that it is You who causes the sun to rise each morning and set each evening and everything else. I, then, must be faithful in recognizing Your hand of mercy in controlling and ordering my life. The Lord willing, I will such and such must be the watch word of my speech. It also serves to remind me that I need to be constantly alert to evaluate every word out of my mouth, every action I am about to take, to insure that You are being glorified. You are Lord and Master of my life.

Thursday,4 April 2013 Psalm 39-:1-5

To the choirmaster: to Jeduthun. A Psalm of David. I said, "I will guard my ways, that I may not sin with my tongue; I will guard my mouth with a muzzle, so long as the wicked are in my presence." I was mute and silent; I held my peace to no avail, and my distress grew worse. My heart became hot within me. As I mused, the fire burned; then I spoke with my tongue: "O LORD, make me know my end and what is the measure of my days; let me know how fleeting I am! Behold, you have made my days a few handbreadths, and my lifetime is as nothing before you. Surely all mankind stands as a mere breath! Selah

Lord, as David did, so must I make a vow before You to guard my tongue even though my thoughts roil and boil within me. I must learn to weigh and measure my words, especially in the presence of unbelievers; my concern must be that I say nothing to cast disgrace upon Your

Holy Name. And when I do speak, let my discourse begin with praise and thanksgiving, acknowledging that You are Lord and Master of my life

Friday, 5 April 2013 Psalm 39:6

Surely a man goes about as a shadow! Surely for nothing they are in turmoil; man heaps up wealth and does not know who will gather!

Is this where Solomon began to understand that all is vanity? Is this the recognition that man is driven by an intense desire to accumulate possessions? Might not this intensity be a sin driven warping of the *Imago Dei*, of the desire of the Almighty to create beauty and display His Glory?

Saturday, 6 April 2013 Psalm 39:7-11

"And now, O Lord, for what do I wait? My hope is in you. Deliver me from all my transgressions. Do not make me the scorn of the fool! I am mute; I do not open my mouth, for it is you who have done it. Remove your stroke from me; I am spent by the hostility of your hand. When you discipline a man with rebukes for sin, you consume like a moth what is dear to him; surely all mankind is a mere breath! Selah

Lord, my hope, my certain expectation of grace and mercy is from You. I know that when I turn from You, when I willfully disobey, that You hide Your face from me unable to be in the presence of sin and corruption. But when the depth of my transgressions is acknowledged You are quick to forgive and restore. You are a gracious and loving Lord.

When I am in distress, Lord and cry out to You, I need to hear You, I need You and Your Comforter. I come to the point where I need to be restored and renewed, do not withhold Yourself from me.

Tuesday, 9 April 2013 I John 4:1-3

Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world. By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you heard was coming and now is in the world already.

Repeat after me: "Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God and every spirit that does not confess Jesus in not from God." And repeat and repeat and ... No ambiguity, no waffling, clear and understandable. Is Jesus Christ a man sent from God or not?

Daily Psalms readings: Morning: Psalm 25 Mid-day: 119:169-176 Evening: Psalm 100

Wednesday, 10 April 2013 I John 4:4-6

Little children, you are from God and have overcome them, for he who is in you is greater than he who is in the world. They are from the world; therefore they speak from the world, and the world listens to them. We are from God. Whoever knows God listens to us; whoever is not from God does not listen to us. By this we know the Spirit of truth and the spirit of error.

More guidance--does our audience take their instruction from the Lord or from the world. A warning to me--seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness. Look first to the Lord and the Word, then being properly armed and armored, I am prepared to evaluate the world's knowledge in the light of God's wisdom.

Daily Psalms readings: Morning: Psalm 26 Mid-day: 119:1-8 Evening: Psalm 101

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us.

If I love (serve) others, I will see God in me for His love will be perfected in me. If I love (serve) others, they will see God in me for His love is perfected in me. If I love (serve) others I will see God (the *Imago Dei*) in them for His love is perfected in me. I believe (am committed to and trust in) these statements. I will see God when His love is perfected in me.

Daily Psalms readings: Morning: Psalm 27 Mid-day: 119:9-16 Evening: Psalm 102

Friday, 12 April 2013 I John 4:13-18

By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him. By this is love perfected with us, so that we may have confidence for the day of judgment, because as he is so also are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love.

You promised to send the Comforter to remind me of all You have said and to guide me into all

truth. And You have fulfilled that promise. The Holy Spirit is always with me. But You continue to give me free will, to chose to obey or to be disobedient. This too is grace, You have not turned me into a robot but have given me a desire to live in obedience to You out of gratitude. I am a new man in You. Praise You, my Lord and my Master.

I John 4:19

We love because he first loved us.

To the choirmaster. A Psalm of David. I waited patiently for the LORD; he inclined to me and heard my cry. He drew me up from the pit of destruction, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure. He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Many will see and fear, and put their trust in the LORD.

Out of the miry bog, the Slough of Despond, onto the Rock of Salvation, a new song in my mouth, the Song of the Almighty, and clothed me in His righteousness. And others will be drawn to Him when the see the great transformation in me. Praise You, my Lord and Master.

Wednesday, 17 April 2013 Psalm 40:6-8

In sacrifice and offering you have not delighted, but you have given me an open ear. Burnt offering and sin offering you have not required. Then I said, "Behold, I have come; in the scroll of the book it is written of me: I delight to do your will, O my God; your law is within my heart."

Obedience is the sacrifice You desire, a sacrifice of joy and in joy, a sacrifice of pleasure and in pleasure, a delightful sacrifice. To know Your statutes and to delight in the obedience, to understand Your statutes and to live according to them is that sacrifice that delights You and You respond with an open ear.

I have told the glad news of deliverance in the great congregation; behold, I have not restrained my lips, as you know, O LORD. I have not hidden your deliverance within my heart; I have spoken of your faithfulness and your salvation; I have not concealed your steadfast love and your faithfulness from the great congregation.

Lord, You know I have no problem speaking of Your great love and mercy before great congregations, I can and do speak of Your deliverance, of Your faithfulness and Your salvation. When the focus of my mind's eye becomes my sins and iniquities, I am consumed with guilt, rampant evil and self-centeredness, but You call me to keep my thoughts on You, to see the great sacrifice and to trust in Your goodness.

Daily Psalms readings:Morning: Psalm 35 Mid-day: 119:73-80 Evening: Psalm 110

Saturday, 20 April 2013 Psalm 40:13-16

Be pleased, O LORD, to deliver me! O LORD, make haste to help me! Let those be put to shame and disappointed altogether who seek to snatch away my life; let those be turned back and brought to dishonor who delight in my hurt! Let those be appalled because of their shame who say to me, "Aha, Aha!" But may all who seek you rejoice and be glad in you; may those who love your salvation say continually, "Great is the LORD!"

Lord, thank You for the many around me who are quick to acknowledge Your greatness, whose speech is filled with praises and the awareness of Your goodness. What an encouragement to be with friends who prepare me for ministry to those who do not acknowledge You or who seek destroy those who love and honor You. Praise You, Lord.

Lord's Day, 21 April 2013 Psalm 119:90

The generations of men who have been recipients of Your faithfulness: Grandpa Spence, Dad, myself, Tony. Will it continue through the generations of my children and grandchildren? Not that You do not offer and make it available but will they accept? Please, Lord, help me a sinner.

To the choirmaster. A Psalm of David. Blessed is the one who considers the poor! In the day of trouble the LORD delivers him; he LORD protects him and keeps him alive; he is called blessed in the land; you do not give him up to the will of his enemies. The LORD sustains him on his sickbed; in his illness you restore him to full health.

Lord, as I think about what it means to consider the poor, my thoughts are directed towards You and the example You set for me. You, the Infinitely Rich One, the Unpoor, the Creator of all and the One to whom all things belong, gave it all up to rescue and redeem one who by his

deliberate actions and choices has taken himself into complete and total poverty. You offer the Ultimate Gift, Your life in exchange for mine; You died that I might live. Hallelujah, what a Savior.

Friday, 3 May 2013 Psalm 42:4

These things I remember, as I pour out my soul: how I would go with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God with glad shouts and songs of praise, a multitude keeping festival.

To join with the brothers in the prison while we may not be a multitude, is indeed a joy-filled evening. Anytime I can enter into worship in spirit and in truth is a soul lifting experience.

Saturday, 4 May 2013 Psalm 42:5-6

Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God. My soul is cast down within me; therefore I remember you from the land of Jordan and of Hermon, from Mount Mizar.

Lord, for those times when I am separated from my familiar surroundings or distraught by problems, all I need to do is turn the eye of my mind to You and to Your faithfulness. How can I be depressed by the sin and confusion that is rampant around me when I know that You are in control of all things. Tuesday, 7 May 2013 Psalm 42:9-11

I say to God, my rock: "Why have you forgotten me? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?" As with a deadly wound in my bones, my adversaries taunt me, while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?" Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

Lord, I have two dear friends who are going to court this morning to watch and wait while their son is indited on drug dealing charges. Surely those around them who know of their faith are wondering, "Where is their God now? Why is He allowing something like this to happen to these people if He is supposed to love and care for them?" Even they may be wondering this morning as they set out on that long trip, where You are in all this.

My prayer is that they are able to praise You, to recognize Your Hand at work in their son's life and in theirs as You support and carry them through this season of distress. That in all this evil and filth, You will be glorified according to the picture painted in Ezekiel 36:22-23, 36 Lord, that through this, my friends can once again praise You, their salvation and their God.

Now when they heard these things they were enraged, and they ground their teeth at him. But he, full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. And he said, "Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." But they cried out with a loud voice and stopped their ears and rushed together at him. Then they cast him out of the city and stoned him. And the witnesses laid down their garments at the

feet of a young man named Saul. And as they were stoning Stephen, he called out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." And falling to his knees he cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." And when he had said this, he fell asleep.

Lord, that I would receive that same clarity of vision that Stephen had; to see You standing at the right hand of the Father interceding for me. That that vision would be with me to sustain and encourage me in my time of trial as it did Stephen.
