The years of our life are seventy, or even by reason of strength eighty; yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away. I have but two choices: to squander my time away or to pass it laboring in Your vineyard. Teach me through Your Holy Spirit to number my days in a way that develops wisdom and advances the Kingdom. It is only through Your Spirit that my wish to serve becomes productive in Your eyes.
