Wednesday, 22 June 2016

Matthew 7:12

"So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.

Now here's a guideline---the Law and the Prophets. If I carefully examine my desires and motives against the template of the Law and the Prophets to determine how I would like to be treated, I will automatically know how to treat others. Lord, forgive me for those times

when there is a disconnect and transform me into Your image.

Thursday, 23 June 2016

Matthew 7:13-14

"Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few.

Another guideline? When the path looks easy and the gate is wide and inviting, it's time for a closer evaluation of the situation. Time to ask a key pair of questions. Is this advancing the Kingdom in the here and now or it taking me into deeper entanglement with the culture? If the latter, I need to run not walk back onto the King's Highway, make the Kingdom turn again.

Friday, 24 June 2016

Matthew 7:15-16

"Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. You will recognize them by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes, or figs from thistles?

The first challenge is to be able to recognize fruit. I've gathered many plump, sweet and juicy blackberries and been roundly scratched for my efforts. I've also bitten into very appealing crab apples only to have my mouth pucker so hard I thought my eyes would cross. But parents, aunts and uncles taught me to distinguish fruit from non-fruit. So it is in the faith with those who have gone before, but I must sit and listen and absorb.

Saturday, 25 June 2016

Matthew 7:17-20

So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus you will recognize them by their fruits.

How do I recognize a good orange vs. one that is not fit to eat? By its color, aroma, firmness and condition of the skin. How do I recognize the fruit of the Spirit? Humm, maybe by living according to Philippians 4:8 as I apply the template of Galatians 5:22? Maybe it would be a good idea to ask a brother or two to hold me accountable?

Lord's Day, 26 June 2016 Psalm 119:27

Make me understand the way of your precepts, and I will meditate on your wondrous works.

Yes, Lord, help me to see Your wondrous works in all things today. Let me see You in every stranger, show me the works of Your hand is sustaining all things, bring me to a state of bubbling joy as I realize the depth and scope of Your creation and redemption.
