> Continuing to examine what the LORD, God the Almighty means when He tells me I must have faith; I must believe, I must trust; I must commit, I must obey. This evidently is not some idle whim on the part of the Almighty, the writer of Hebrews tells me it is **impossible** to please the LORD God the Almighty without faith, etc.

I have been proposing that to believe in something is to have a complete, an all encompassing conviction of that something's existence. Therefore, my initial reaction needs to be an appropriate version of "Wow, look what God is doing?" I need to deliberately foster a desire to search for God's hand in **everything.**

A lot can be learned from the Celtic Christians of the 5th through 10th centuries as they practiced lives based on recognizing the hand of God everywhere.

Romans 8:28

And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.

I am convinced that these two verses are so linked together that they must be regarded as the two sides of the same coin. Side 1 tells me that He rewards me, a seeker after Him. Side 2 directs me to search out the good in everything--at all times--in all things--whatever the circumstances.

For starters, no complaining or grumbling but always with a mouth that praises the Lord and gives thanks in all circumstances. Work to be done.

A life whose public manifestation is one of rejoicing. Rejoicing in all circumstances. A life being lived from moment to moment in the joy of the Lord. A life of contrition and humility, being lived in service to others. A life that honors the LORD, God the Almighty and and its neighbors. **Rejoice always!**
