Monday, 29 August 2016

1 Peter 5:6-7

Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you.

I did not realize until recently that my anxieties were an expression of my pride in my self-sufficiency. "How am <u>I</u> going to fix this problem? Fuss and stew. Stew and fuss." If I truly believe/trust/have faith that the LORD, God the Almighty cares for me, I will turn the problem over to Him and rejoice as He deals with the situation. I need to acknowledge that I am totally incapable and He is totally capable.

Tuesday, 30 August 2016 Psalms 55:22

Cast your burden on the LORD, and he will sustain you; he will never permit the righteous to be moved.

Another expression of humility. Even those tasks and responsibilities that I am convinced are within my capabilities, that I am fully confident that I can handle; am I willing to cede control to the Lord and seek His guidance in the execution? Am I willing to admit to Him that He is far more able to direct my efforts than I am? Hummm, there is a lot of room for improvement.

Wednesday, 31 August 2016 Matthew 6:31-34 [1]

Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.

So many of my anxieties are focused in the material realm. "What am I going to eat for lunch? How am I going to pay the mortgage this month? Is that ache another symptom of a new ailment?" There is not a single element that my Father is not aware of, moreover has not already provided

for. TRUST ME, John!

Thursday, 1 September 2016 Matthew 6:31-34 [2]

For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. What's this 'seek' business? My old friend, the instruction to trust His righteousness, to have faith in His goodness, to believe in His promises, to obey His commandments. To walk that narrow and straight path, the King's Highway through the Kingdom of Heaven in the here and now.
