What is a soul friend?

A soul friend is just that – a friend of your soul. Soul friends help one another in their walk with and work for the Lord by committing to pray, encourage, and hold one another accountable for specific goals in their journey.

Soul friends meet together, share their concerns with one another, rejoice in one another's victories and progress in the Kingdom, and work together to press on toward the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus (Phil. 3.14).

Soul friends thus play an integral role in our maintaining a careful and consistent self-watch in our walk with and work for the Lord (Prov. 4.20-27; Eph. 5.15-21).
