Thus says the LORD: "Cursed is the man who trusts in man and makes flesh his strength, whose heart turns away from the LORD. He is like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see any good come. He shall dwell in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land.

A friend and I went out into the New Mexico desert one day to search for artifacts in an abandoned Indian village. I, fresh from the lush suburbs of Chicago, had no comprehension of the raw in-hospitality of a desert. I could not comprehend how that village, estimated to be a population around 2000 people, survived. No water for miles! No wild life to hunt and feed on! Totally nothing but cactus and scrub bushes.

An almost perfect simile a for life which is turned from the LORD and trusts in the faithlessness of man.

Wednesday, 15 February 2017 Jeremiah 17:7-8

"Blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, whose trust is the LORD. He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit."

What a contrast, the barren Chihuahua Desert vs. the lush fields of lowa where I was raised. Grandpa's farm was truly a land of milk and honey--gallons of fresh milk from his Guernsey herd, honey from the beehives and apples from the orchards.

A rich land vs. a fierce land. Life of righteousness, peace and joy in the Kingdom of Heaven vs. life of anxiety and uncertainty in Satan's realm. My choice.

Thursday, 16 February 2017 Jeremiah 22:3-5

Thus says the LORD: Do justice and righteousness, and deliver from the hand of the oppressor him who has been robbed. And do no wrong or violence to the resident alien, the fatherless, and the widow, nor shed innocent blood in this place. For if you will indeed obey this word, then there shall enter the gates of this house kings who sit on the throne of David, riding in chariots and on horses, they and their servants and their people. But if you will not obey these words, I swear by myself, declares the LORD, that this house shall become a desolation.

Another of Jeremiah's 'either or' examples of how our life in the Kingdom is to be lived. Obedience and result vs. disobedience and result. How will I approach the working out of my salvation (Philippians 2:12-13)?

Am I going to love my neighbor and express that love through a hands-on application to them? I need to thoughtfully and prayerfully apply myself to all my interactions with my Personal Mission Field on a daily basis. Friday, 17 February 2017 Jeremiah 22:3-5

The result of disobedience? A life wracked by worry and anxiety? A life spent in a spiritual Chihuahua desert? How can I expect that the LORD, God, the Almighty will answer my prayers and pleas when I refuse to obey and trust Him? I need to ask myself whether or not I am truly one of the sheep of His pasture if I refuse to trust Him in all things.

Lord's Day, 19 February 2017 Psalm 119:133 Keep steady my steps according to your promise, and let no iniquity get dominion over me.

O, Lord, that my daily walk would be one of glorifying You, seeking always to proclaim Your Kingdom and Your Goodness. Keep me from sin, keep me from straying, help me, Lord.
