Monday, 16 January 2017 Proverbs 28:25

A greedy man stirs up strife, but the one who trusts in the LORD will be enriched.

I think an acceptable paraphrase would be. "A man who does not trust the LORD stirs up strife." Greed, coupled with impatience, drives me to a lack of trust; I am not able under these circumstances to wait on the LORD and the resulting condition is strife.

Tuesday, 17 January 2017 Proverbs 29:25

The fear of man lays a snare, but whoever trusts in the LORD is safe.

Fear/trust of man's promises always come with a whiff of the hidden snare. Fear/trust in the LORD's promises always come with the sweet incense of His love for His people. The foul miasma of man's greed vs. the pleasant aroma of the LORD's love for us. The choice is mine.

Wednesday, 18 January 2017 Isaiah 1:19-20

"If you are willing and obedient, you shall eat the good of the land; but if you refuse and rebel, you shall be eaten by the sword; for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

"Eat the good of the land" Which land? It is not guaranteed that I will eat the good of the United States of America, but it is guaranteed that I will enjoy the fruits of life in the Kingdom of Heaven if I am willing and obedient. A life of Godly contentment where I need not be anxious for anything; where I have the great blessing of knowing each morning as I arise that I am secure in the hands of the LORD, God the Almighty.

Thursday, 19 January 2017 Isaiah 12:2

"Behold, God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid; for the LORD GOD is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation."

I need this verse imprinted on the lens of my eyes so that I view all of life through this precept. There is no event, **NO THING**, that is not covered by this precious promise. The only question is will I trust or will I doubt?

Friday, 20 January 2017 Isaiah 26:3

You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you.

"Perfect peace" is the *tertium quid*, the gold standard by which I am able to evaluate the extent to which I trust the LORD, God, the Almighty. No little squiggle of doubt, no wakening in the middle of the night in a cold sweat of fear and desperation. Any uncertainty at any point in this spectrum should drive me to my knees in repentance to seek the LORD's assurance of His trustworthiness.

Saturday, 21 January 2017 Isaiah 26:4

Trust in the LORD forever, for the LORD GOD is an everlasting rock.

There was an insurance company many years ago that advertised that they were as permanent as the Rock of Gibraltar. (Maybe they still do) But even that Rock is not an Everlasting Rock.

This Everlasting Rock is harder, more brilliant than any diamond. I find it beyond my comprehension to grasp

an infinity large, infinitely brilliant, infinitely iridescent Being that says, "Trust Me, I will never leave you or forsake you,"

Lord's Day, 22 January 2017 Psalm 119:104

Through your precepts I get understanding; therefore I hate every false way.

As I grow in understanding through study and meditation upon Your Word, one of the results is growth in my awareness of evil and its consequences. I develop in my hatred of evil, in my unwillingness to tolerate evil, in my revulsion of evil and in my compulsion to shine the light of Your Word in those dark places. I must continue to hide Your Word in my heart.
