Observation

Describe each of the objects in this painting, in terms of name, color, and relationship to each other.

How do the objects taken together seem to relate to the title of the work?

To which of these objects are you most attracted? Why?

Explanation

What seems to be going on here? If you had to make a story of this painting, and share it with a child, what would you say? How does the title of the painting shape your explanation?

Association

What experiences of these objects come to mind as you view this work? Does your experience of these add anything to your enjoyment or understanding of the work? In what way?

Philip R. Jackson paints from out of the framework of a Christian worldview, and Christian themes frequently show up in his work. Does the "story" suggested by this painting bring to mind any spiritual issues or theological truths?

Meditate on John 14.6; Matthew 11.28-30; Matthew 16.24, 25; 1 John 2.1-6; and John 17.6-12. Assign a role, based on these verses, to each of the objects in this painting.

Meditate on and sing Psalm 23, as indicated:

Tune: The Gift of Love – "Though I May Speak with Bravest Fire" vv. 1, 2

Because the Lord my Shepherd is, I shall not want, for I am His! He makes me lie in pastures full; I rest in Him by waters still.

vv. 3, 4

My soul He quickens and will bless; He leads in paths of righteousness. Though I may walk in death's dark vale, I shall not fear – He will not fail!

vv. 4, 5

The Lord is ever by my side; His rod and staff with me abide. A table rich for me He spreads; with oil my Lord anoints my head.

v. 6

Goodness and mercy, full and free, shall ever after follow me, And in the house of God, my Lord, shall I abide forevermore!

How does this psalm apply to those who follow Jesus as their Leader?

Interpretation
