Tuesday, 19 November 2019 Psalm 77:7-9

"Will the Lord spurn forever, and never again be favorable? Has his steadfast love forever ceased? Are his promises at an end for all time? Has God forgotten to be gracious? Has he in anger shut up his compassion?" Selah

How good it is to remember Your work in our lives and to know that You have been watching over our steps all the days of our lives. Those early memories of learning to read through family prayers in the old KJV Bible. There it is, tattered with loose pages, but an Ebenezer to remind us of Your Goodness and Faithfulness.

Wednesday, 20 November 2019 Psalm 77:10-15

Then I said, "I will appeal to this, to the years of the right hand of the Most High." I will remember the deeds of the LORD; yes, I will remember your wonders of old. I will ponder all your work, and meditate on your mighty deeds. Your way, O God, is holy. What god is great like our God? You are the God who works wonders; you have made known your might among the peoples. You with your arm redeemed your people, the children of Jacob and Joseph. Selah

Lord, lead us in the restoration of these relationships. Show us what steps and actions we need to take to be once again able to enjoy all the pleasures of kinship in the Body of Christ. Help our spouses and us to remember and share the countless evidence of Your love in our lives together. Friday, 22 November 2019

I have more understanding than all my teachers, for your testimonies are my meditation. I understand more than the aged, for I keep your precepts. I hold back my feet from every evil way, in order to keep your word. I do not turn aside from your rules, for you have taught me.

We wish! We hunger for these statements to be true. Lord, when will we become so one with You that Your Word is our meditation all day long? We know that Your Instructions are always with us, but we don't always listen.

We do have more understanding than all the influences of the world -- when we meditate upon and consider Your testimonies. We do see the pitfalls of the age-old wisdom of the culture when measured against Your Wisdom -- if we do so!

Your Rules are our guide; they place our feet securely upon Your Path; they keep us from stumbling into evil and reoffending. You are ever at our side.

Saturday, 23 November 2019 Psalm 119:103-104

Your Words layout the Way Everlasting before us, warning against the rocks and roots that would cause us to stumble while illuminating life in Your Kingdom. Your Words bring wisdom and understanding; it is our

Lord's Day, November 2019 Exodus 20:1-2, 8

And God spoke all these words, saying, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. ... Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy."

Isaiah 58:13-14 "If you turn back your foot from the Sabbath, from doing your pleasure on my holy day, and call the Sabbath a delight and the holy day of the LORD honorable; if you honor it, not going your own ways, or seeking your own pleasure, or talking idly; then you shall take delight in the LORD, and I will make you ride on the heights of the earth; I will feed you with the heritage of Jacob your father, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

Is there a fine line between spending Lord's Day afternoon in the garden because it needs to be weeded and spending that same afternoon nurturing and cherishing the plants and produce that the Lord has blessed us with? No, the line is not fine, it is broad, black and easily observable by us. Are we there because those weeds are getting ahead of us, and we didn't have or take the time during the week to get rid of those nuisances, so, forgive us, Lord, but Your Day is a weeding day. Or are we on our knees thanking the Lord for the life of each plant, anticipating the bounty that He will provide in the harvest, looking for the interplay between weed and plant to see the beauty of His creation? Do we see our gardens as places of communion with the Lord of the Creation to be savored for a time, or as places of drudgery that needs to be done so we can take a Sunday afternoon nap? One honors, one dishonors. It is our choice.
