Call to Worship

Hymn of Praise

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Silent Meditation

Psalm 46.7, 8, 11

The Ministry of the Word

Psalm 46

Here the Leader may read the passage for today, or members may take turns reading verses until the entire passage has been read.

Leader:

The theme of this psalm reminds us of the Lord Jesus' promise in Matthew 28.20, that He will be with us always, no matter what, to the end of the age. To make this promise emphatic, the theme is repeated in verses 1, 7, and 11.

Psalm 46.1-7 reminds us that the Lord of hosts is with us, and that He is our safe and reliable refuge, whatever trial or difficulty we may be facing.

1. In view of this, what should we not do? (v. 2) How can we help one another in this?

2. Who is the City of God? What are the "streams" that refresh that City (John 7.37-39)? How can we encourage one another to partake of that refreshment?

3. The earth may crumble, nations may rage, and kingdoms may fall apart. But what remains firm and strong? (v. 6)

Psalm 46.8-11 counsels us to see the world from God's vantage point (cf. Ephesians 2.6). He rules over even the worst disasters, and He determines when they must end.

4. How should knowing this bring us comfort in these times?

5. What does it mean to "Be still" before the Lord? What are we hoping to "know" in that stillness? How does knowing this bless and help us?

6. God has exalted Jesus to His right hand, and given Him all authority in heaven and in earth (cf. Philippians 2.5-11; Matthew 28.18). But He insists on being exalted "among the nations" and "in all the earth" (v. 10). What is our role in this great work? How can we encourage and assist one another in this?

Meditate in silence on the teaching of this psalm.

All (sharing): Summarize in one thought what God wants us to learn from this meditation on Psalm.

Hymn of Faith and Obedience

Psalm 46.1-3, 6-11

God is our refuge and our strength; He is our help in times of need. Thus though the earth beneath us should change, the sea consume the mountain range; Waters may roar with raging speed; yet God will rescue us at length.
