# The Ministry of the Word

1 Corinthians 10.12, 13

Here the Leader will read the passage for today, or ask another to read it.

#### Leader:

Asaph, who led worship in the days of King Solomon, can help us in understanding Paul's meaning in this text. In Psalm 73, Asaph was faced with a powerful temptation, which he described in verses 2-14. Would someone read these verses for us?

- 1. How would you describe Asaph's temptation? What was he observing? How did that make him feel?
- 2. Just in the nick of time, however, Asaph realized that his "feet had almost stumbled" and he "had nearly slipped." How did he express this realization (v. 15)? What does this mean? What happened in Asaph as he considered this temptation?

As we shall see, God met Asaph, in the midst of his temptation, and began leading him through the way of escape. What is temptation? German theologian Helmut Thielicke described temptation as finding ourselves at the point of wanting to be disloyal to God. Temptation is not sin; rather, temptation is the common experience of every one of us, as Paul indicates in 1 Corinthians 10.13.

3. How do we know that temptation is not sin (Heb. 4.15)?

When temptation comes, we have a choice: We can *fall* through temptation into sin; or we can *grow* through temptation into greater sanctification in the Lord. In Psalm 73, Asaph directs us to several "ways of escape" that can enable us to grow through, rather than fall through, the temptations we face each day. Let's see if we can identify them.

- 4. The first is mentioned in verse 15. What would have been the result of Asaph's falling through temptation into sin? How does this serve to help us escape through temptation?
- 5. The next step in a way of escape through temptation is indicated in verses 16, 17. What did Asaph do to get clarity on this temptation, and to find the way of escape? How does this guide us in seeking the way of escape through temptation?
- 6. Next, what is Asaph doing in verses 18-20 to help him overcome his temptation? How should we practice this?
- 7. Look at verses 21 and 22. What kind of attitude toward sin does this indicate? How can this be part of a way of escape through temptation?

8. Finally, in verses 23-25 Asaph turns to the Lord in prayer. How would you summarize the gist of this prayer, and how can it help us in finding the way of escape through temptation?

In verses 26-28, Asaph concludes his struggle with temptation by reaffirming his faith and trust in God, and his determination to declare and do the works of the Lord. How can we apply this step to our faith in Jesus, and our desire to be made increasingly like Him?

Meditate in silence on the teaching of 1 Corinthians 10.13.
