Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, dead, and buried;
He descended into hell.
The third day He rose again from the dead.

He ascended into heaven and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

The Ministry of the Word

2 Corinthians 10.13-18

The Leader will read the passage for today, or ask another to read it.

Leader:

We're going to focus on two main points in these verses – the idea of a *sphere* and the nature of the *boasting* we should bring into that sphere.

Paul said that God had appointed to him a sphere within which to do the work to which he had been called.

1. What did Paul mean by sphere? How would you describe Paul's sphere?

Paul was appointed to a particular *sphere* – a place of service in which to seek the Kingdom and glory of God. We have all been likewise called to seek the Kingdom and glory of God, as Paul reminds us in 1 Thessalonians 2.12. And, if we are to be imitators of Paul, as Paul was of Jesus (1 Corinthians 11.1), we must assume that God has also appointed to us a *sphere* within which to pursue our Kingdom-and-glory calling.

2. How would you define the *sphere* God has appointed to you?

Paul summarized the work he did in that sphere as boasting. Look again at verses 14-16.

3. What was Paul *boasting* about in his *sphere?* How did he do that? How should we, who are called to imitate him, practice such *boasting* in our own *sphere?*

Verses 17 and 18 provide an important caveat to define the nature of our *boasting*. To boast as Paul did is to glory in the Lord, and *not* to commend ourselves. We must be ready, at every opportunity in our appointed *sphere*, to boast about Him, not beyond measure (v. 13) – that is, of things we have not truly known – but as God is glorified and reveals Himself to and through us in our *sphere*. Such boasting is meant to honor and glorify God; but other objectives should also be kept in mind. How would you define each of the following goals for the *boasting* we do in our *sphere*:

4. Verse 14: "we came with the Gospel of Christ"

- 5. Verse 15: "as your faith is increased, we shall be greatly enlarged by you in our sphere"
- 6. Verse 16: "to preach the Gospel beyond you"

We can think of our appointed *sphere* as our Personal Mission Field – that place, and those people, to whom Jesus sends us, as He was sent, to bring near the Kingdom of righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit (John 20.21; Romans 14.17, 18).

Let us seek Jesus daily, so that He may give us much to boast about concerning Him!

Meditate in silence on the teaching of 2 Corinthians 10.13-18.

All (sharing):

Summarize in one thought what God wants us to learn from this meditation.
