Call to Worship

Psalm 34.4, 5 (adapted)

Leader:

Let us seek the Lord together.

People:

For He will hear us, and He will deliver us from all our fears.

All:

We look to You, Lord, to see Your glory, that we might be radiant like You!

Invocation and Call to Confession

Leader:

O Lord Jesus, we know it is the desire and work of Your Spirit to transform us into Your likeness, that You might increase in us, and we might decrease! And yet we are so far from being like You, and still so much bound up in our old ways and lives. As we come to You this morning, Lord, eager to see Your glory, search us by Your Spirit, as we confess our sins silently to You. **Hear our silent confessions, Lord.**

Leader:

The righteous cry out, and the LORD hears, And delivers them out of all their troubles. The LORD is near to those who have a broken heart, And saves such as have a contrite spirit.

When I cried to God, He heard me, and from trouble rescued me. 'Round their camp His angel lingers that they may delivered be.

Prayers of Praise and Thanksgiving

All

All may offer prayers of praise and thanksgiving to the Lord. At the end, let the Leader lead the people in praying the Lord's Prayer.

Offerings to the Lord

Leader:

Let us now bring our offerings to honor the Lord and edify one another by His Word: a passage of Scripture which has been particularly helpful; a brief word of praise for some grace of God bestowed; an observation from creation which revealed the glory of the Lord; a word of appreciation for some aspect of the beauty, goodness, or truth of the Lord. When all have shared, the **Leader shall pray**:

We give You thanks and praise, O Lord, and offer our confession of faith together (all together, saying the Apostles' Creed);

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried: He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Ministry of the Word

Luke 19.1-10

The Leader will read the passage for today, or ask another to read it. Have someone prepared to read each of the passages mentioned in the first paragraph of today's study.

Leader:

The clear teaching of Scripture is that God is at work within us, by the power of His Holy Spirit, to transform us increasingly into the likeness of Jesus Christ. We are God's makeover project. He calls us to set our minds on Jesus (Colossians 3.1-3) so that we might learn Him (Ephesians 4.17-24), put on Jesus (Romans 13.14), and be made like Him. This is, in fact, the very destination of our lives, as John reminds us in 1 John 3.1-3.

1. How do you experience God working in you to make you more like Jesus?

It will help us to increase in the likeness of Jesus if we can see Him in certain roles, which we also might learn to embrace. In our text for today, Jesus describes Himself as a "seeker".

- 2. How is it evident, throughout Jesus' earthly sojourn, that He actively sought people?
- 3. What is He doing in Luke 19.1-10 that identifies Him as a seeker?

When we see Jesus in His glory, as Paul describes in 2 Corinthians 3.17, 18, we should see Him as a seeker. As we are transformed into His image, we too, should become seekers. Let's think about that for a bit.

4. What would someone be doing who was a seeker?

We are being transformed into the likeness of Jesus. Thus, we should expect increasingly to become a seeker like Jesus was, seeking the lost and seeking others, for the purpose of bringing near the Kingdom of God. Most of us are not naturally inclined to seek others in order to reach them with God's grace. We tend to wait for others to seek and reach out to us. But if we're learning Jesus, even putting on Jesus, we must allow the Spirit of Jesus to shape us into His seeking image.

5. What are some things we could do to become seekers like Jesus?

Seekers like Jesus set their minds on reaching out to others, to bring the grace and truth of God to them by word and deed. May God help us to improve as seekers, and thus to increase in the likeness of Jesus Christ.

Meditate in silence on the teaching of Luke 19.1-10.

Summarize in one thought what God wants us to learn from this meditation.
